Student Awards Inception

It's over – and the Phi Sigma Epsilon Alumni Association has \$4,000 less in interest-generated savings from our monetary investments in the bank.

The occasion – The First Annual Phi Sigma Epsilon Alumni Association Student Awards, given in \$500 increments to eight Eastern Illinois University students whose fathers were "Phi Sigs" at Eastern. Because these monetary awards are not premised upon the traditional concept of a scholarship based on academic merit, the P.S.E. Alumni Board has chosen to call them Student Awards instead of Scholarships.

The idea for these student awards had been brought forth by one or more Phi Sig Alums over the past few years. After considerable discussion by the P.S.E. Alumni Association Board, the ideas were finally developed into a plan of action that was explained in the Spring '91 newsletter.

On August 18, 1991, that plan of action finally came to fruition at What's Cookin' Restaurant in Charleston. Seven families, from different areas of the state, were on hand for the Honorary Luncheon and Awards Presentation with the Phi Sigma Epsilon Alumni Association Board. P.S.E. Alumni Association President Boone Chaney served as the Master of Ceremonies with Secretary-Treasurer Jeff Moore and Vice President Gary Brinkmeyer and wife Sharon also being present. After a self-introduction by the invited families of the Student Award recipients, dinner and conversation between new acquaintances and old friends ensued. The Student Awards were individually presented to the Eastern students and pictures to capture the moment were taken. Unfortunately, because it was such a busy day, with students moving back to Eastern and Rush activities in progress, two of our Award recipients were not able to be present. We were assured by their parents, however, that they would be happy to accept the Award in their childrens' absence. Those receiving the Student Awards and their respective Phi Sig fathers are shown listed in the accompanying copy of an article in the Charleston *Times-Courier* newspaper from the August 27, 1991 edition.

The P.S.E. Alumni Association is proud to have initiated this type of Awards presentation and looks forward to maintaining it through the years ahead. It is structured to be a totally self-sufficient endeavor on our part and will continue until such time that there are no longer any students of old "Phi Sigs" to be helped. Recipients of Phi Sig Alumni Awards

CHARLESTON – Eight Eastern Illinois University students are recipients of the first Phi Sigma Epsilon Alumni Association Student Awards.

The eight students are all children of former members of the fraternity, which no longer operates at Eastern.

The monetary awards will be presented annually to qualified Eastern students whose fathers are members of the Phi Sigma Epsilon Alumni Association-Delta Chapter in Charleston.

Those receiving the first scholarships were freshmen Mary Beth Long of Springfield, daughter of Roger Long, and Nicole Collins of Crystal Lake, daughter of Gary Collins; sophomores Paige Hood of Belleville, daughter of Dick Hood, and Karin Garbe of Edwardsville, daughter of Gale Garbe; juniors Tracy Swanson of Grant Park, daughter of Tom Swanson, and Jennifer Mauerer of Decatur, daughter of John Closs; and seniors Brett Collins of Crystal Lake, son of Gary Collins, and Timothy McChristian of Collinsville, son of Jerry McChristian.

The students' fathers were Eastern students in the 1960s.

Phi Sigma Epsilon social fraternity was the first Greek organization at Eastern, organizing in 1930.

With the sale a couple of years ago of the most recent home for the fraternity, 1509 Second St., the fraternity's alumni association began planning for its future. The awards presentation was the first action from that planning.


Note: the dates on the plaque actually represent the period of time Phi Sigma Epsilon – Delta Chapter was on Campus. The Alumni Association is still very much alive.
