Phi Sigs - Delta Chapter - The Third House

After living 5 years at the original Sixth St. House and then about 2 years at the second House on Seventh St., Phi Sigma Epsilon was notified during the first week of May 1937 that their Seventh St. residence had been sold from under them. This action precipitated a frantic search to secure another House prior to the beginning of the Fall 1937 school session. Due mainly to the efforts of Ben Edman, then PSE President, and Jim Rice, then quartermaster, Phi Sigma Epsilon negotiated a oneyear lease for a larger house, owned by Miss Elsie Stiff, at 1422 Fourth St. According to a June 22, 1937 Teachers College News article "The new house will accommodate six more than were able to room at the old one and has the added advantage of greater proximity to the campus. Mr. Rice hopes to put twenty men in the seven large bedrooms. Last spring, twenty Phi Sig members signified their desire to stay at the new house." Also from the same article "It is planned that the roomy basement of the building be converted into a recreation room with a pool table. There is a large hall adaptable to house parties." A later article from the Sept. 21, 1937 Teachers College News indicates that the pool table did indeed find a spot in the large basement and that "ample dining facilities make it an ideal fraternity house." It goes on to state that "The dining service started yesterday morning, using the same cooperative plan employed before. Marvin Upton and Emmett Shipley are head cooks." Finally, in a look to the future, the article says that "According to Jim Rice, plans are being laid to buy some new furniture and

The house at 1422 Fourth St. no longer stands. In its place is a local Bar/Restaurant called Stix. A search through the county courthouse records did not turn up a picture of the house, but a

P.S.E. TIDBITS

-Two Phi Sigs, who were former EIU athletes, were inducted into the EIU Hall of Fame on Sept. 17, 1994 in Charleston. They are C. Roger Sorenson ('49) and Darrell Brown ('75). Roger lettered 4 years and was rated as the Panthers top tennis player immediately after World War II. He was the No. 1 singles and No. 1 doubles for all 4 years at EIU and has established EIU scholarships in his name for tennis, golf and business. Roger lives in Houston, Tx., where he retired as an executive with Texaco, Inc.

Darrell Brown won the 1974 National long jump championship and still holds the EIU school record for long jump at 25'7.25", the second oldest track and field record. Darrell also ran a leg on the National 5th place 440 yd. relay team and earned eight All-America honors in 3 years. Additionally, he placed second and third in National long jump competition in 1972 and 1973 respectively, while also running a leg of the 880 yd. relay team, which still holds the school record. Darrell works for the Hoopeston area School District, where he is a Health Education teacher and directs the school transportation department.

The PSE Alumni Assn. wishes to extend its personal congratulations to these two Brothers.

more successful search through the old Eastern Warblers turned up a picture, hereby reproduced, but with lesser quality than recent photos of our previous Houses. As you can see, it appears to be a very large 2-story house, with a large porch and ample upstairs windows, indicating the probable upstairs bedrooms. The one-year lease came to an end in August 1938, when the Phi Sigs became the first fraternity to buy their own House, this one located at 1431 Ninth St. Apparently they were tired of shuffling from one residence to another and not controlling their own destiny. Quite a bit is known about this House, as it still stands and many individuals who lived in it have stories to tell. Look for that House story in the Spring 1995 Phi Sig Newsletter.
